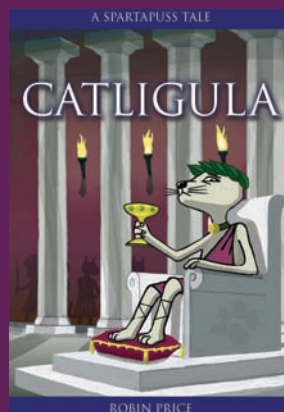
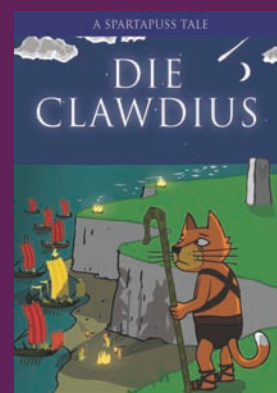
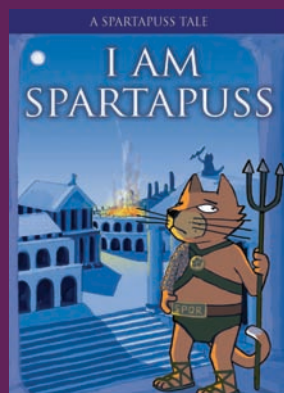

## 5. WRITE A SIMPLE PLAN:

### EXAMPLE PLAN:

1. Julius, the hero, is a soldier in the Roman Army. He is from a rich family.
2. He wears a gold ring for good luck.
3. Before the battle, he buries the ring for safe-keeping in a forest.
4. The battle starts. Julius is killed in a fight with Lucius, the 'baddie'.
5. Julius' gold ring stays buried for two-thousand years, until...

### STORY-WRITING TIPS:

1. Don't plan too much! Just plan enough to get the 'shape' of your story.
2. You can also write down things for your characters to say in the plan.
3. When your plan is finished, read it back carefully and tweak it.
4. When you are happy with your plan, start writing your story in full.
